Reading Vocabulary

1. advanced – in front of others; forward
2. developed – to bring into being or activity
3. exhausted – to tire very much
4. headquarters – place from which the chief or commanding officer of an army, police force etc., sends out orders
5. impossible – 1. Not capable of being done or happening; not possible 2. Not possible to use; not to be done
6. intense – very much; very great; very strong; extreme
7. messages – words sent or delivered from one person or group to another
8. reveal – to make known
9. persuade – to cause someone to do something or to think a certain way about something, by giving them good reasons for it
10. reasons – an explanation for why an idea might be right or true
11. points – ideas that authors present to convince readers that something is true
12. evidence – facts, details, quotes, or other pieces of information used to support a claim, point, or an idea
