P.5.5A Properties of Matter


Matter is anything that has mass and takes up space. Matter is made of <u>elements</u>.

An <u>element</u> is material that cannot be broken down into anything simpler. It is made entirely of from one type of <u>atom</u>.

<u>Atoms</u> are the smallest unit of an element that retains the properties of that element.

Atoms: too small to see; made of protons (+), neutrons (=), and electrons (-).



Atoms combine to make <u>molecules</u>. For example: H₂O 2 hydrogen atoms combine with 1 oxygen atom to make 1 molecule of water.

Physical Properties of Matter

Physical properties can be observed or measured do not change the matter itself.

State of Matter

There are 3 common states of matter: solid, liquid, and gas.

State of matter	Particle Spacing/Movement	Shape	Volume
Solid	Tightly packed/almost no movement	Definite	Definite
Liquid	Closely spaced/ flow past each other	No definite shape	Definite
Gas	Far apart/ move easily	No definite shape	No definite volume
